Every club has to supply a judge for a competition. Wolverhampton Gymnastics Club has invested this year in expanding its judging capability.

To this end Abbie Evans (who has been a Club Level Judge for Wolverhampton for a few years now) took the Women's Artistic Gymnastics Regional Judge course. Having passed this course she can now act in the role of Head Judge at Regional Competitions.

There were a number of our young volunteers who took the Women's Artistic Gymnastics Club Judge course in November. This was a 4 day course which took place at Park Wrekin Gymnastics Club in Telford.

What are the Level Competitions?

The Regional Level Competitions are competed within each Region of the UK. Wolverhampton Gymnastics Club is part of the West Midlands Region. There are number of competitions (those highlighted had entries from Wolverhampton).

For In-Age Level competitions 4 and 3, the top four in the competition go on to compete at the Levels Final and the 5th place travels as a reserve. The competition is in November and this year was held in Guildford, Surrey.

Unfortunately this year Wolves had a number of injuries that meant some gymnasts had to sit out for the competitions. They have all now made a full recovery since and were back in full training for the team competitions.

Medals were awarded for 1st, 2nd & 3rd place and rosettes for 4th, 5th & 6th place. A rosette was also awarded for 1st place on individual apparatus.

At the Levels we received a number of Rosettes. Well done to all those who competed.

At Level 2 Ellen Groves executed routines with a high level of difficulty and was rewarded with a $6^{\rm th}$ place rosette. Well Done.



At Level 3 - In age Karyce Johnson

In the Level 4 Out-of-age 12+ Erin Morris had a consistent all round performance finishing 4th overall and receiving a rosette. She was awarded a second rosette for her first place position on Floor and achieved a third place on bars. Well Done Erin!



REGIONAL LEVELS COMPETITION - LEVEL 5 29th October 2017 - Chase Leisure Centre

The Level 5 Competition traditionally takes place at least one month after the other levels competitions. There are three competitions:

Level 5 - In Age, Level 5 - Out-of-age 9/10, Level 5 - Out-of-age 11/12

These competitions have a large participant level. This year there were 49 gymnasts in the In Age Competition and 75 competitors in the Out-of-Age 9/10 competition. Wolverhampton Gymnastics Club entered 5 gymnasts all from Mel's group.


Onwards and upwards now.

Level 5 In age

All three gymnasts in this competition were amazing, putting in very strong performances. Lexie came 2nd overall and was awarded the Silver Medal, her strongest piece was beam where she received the 3rd highest score.

Beatrice came 6th and received a Rosette, her strongest piece was Vault with a 4th place position.

Evie received a Rosette for her 1st place score on Bars and finished in 9th place overall. All three gymnasts scored well over 46 marks. Amazing.



In the Level 5 out-of-age competition we had two competitors. They were also amazing - both scoring over 48 marks.

Sarah Fraser finished the overall competition in 2nd place earning her the Silver Medal. She scored 1st place on Floor and received a Rosette and 2nd place on Vault.

Ruby Wafer finished 5th overall and received a Rosette. She also received a Rosette for her 1st place position on Vault and had the 2nd highest score on Bars.

National Levels Final - November 2017

Each year the UK holds a Level Final, this year it took place in Guildford, Surrey. Each region of the UK submits a team which consists of their top four gymnasts at the Regional Levels. The fifth place holder travels as a reserve and steps in should they be required on the day. The sixth place holder at Regional becomes a non travelling reserve, they attend should one of the top five withdraw from the competition.



This year in the Level 3 Team for the West Midlands, Wolverhampton had two gymnasts, Karyce Johnson who came **4**th in the Regional Competition and Libby Woodhall who finished 9th in the Region but was requested to travel (a week before the competition) as the reserve.



Karyce Johnson performed well under an amazing amount of pressure. You are competing against your peers from all over the UK and your picture is shown on screens and your scores are displayed as you move around the competition.

Libby did not compete but performed her role well as a supportive and motivating team member.

Both girls stepped up to the mark and did themselves and the club proud. They also got to meet the amazing Olympic gymnast Max Whitlock.

They were accompanied by Gemma, Abbie and Mr Bob

Jones.

This was the second time this year a Wolverhampton gymnast has competed at a National Level. Back in May, Hayley Rushton competed at the National Grade Finals. Who'd have thought just 5 months later her team mates would be competing in another National Competition. Team work and motivating paying off.

Team Competitions

In November the Club took part in two team competitions. The competitions were in Level groups and based on Level rules. The first competition was on the 19th November 2017 in Cannock. The club entered two teams. One team were in the Level 5 competition and one in the Level 3 competition.

For this competition each entry consisted of a team of up to 6 gymnasts. Five gymnasts competed on each piece and the top four scores counted.

All gymnasts performed well and they finished overall in 2nd place and awarded a blue rosette. Karyce Johnson was also awarded a rosette for the highest score on Beam.

The second team competition - held one week later, was an Apparatus Team Competition. This is the first time this competition has been held for a number of years. In this competition each team had 4 competitors. Each gymnast performed one piece of apparatus, the scores were added together to give a total score for the four pieces.

Wolverhampton entered one team at Level 5, two teams at Level 3 and one team at FIG (the level above Level 2).

Level 5 were up in the first round and despite the early start finished in a well deserved 3rd place. Well done girls you have had an amazing first year of competing!





At Level 3 Team A came 3rd and was awarded a white rosette. Both teams performed exceptionally well with the scores very close.

The FIG team went around at the same time as the Level 3. The team performed very difficult routines and looked amazing finishing overall in first place and receiving a red rosette.
